Rush and Gush Survey

This survey is being distributed to the residents, landowners, stakeholders and friends of Easdale Island to let you know what's been happening over at the Rush and Gush and to give you an opportunity to have your say in the next stage.

This survey is being undertaken by Suzanne McIntosh Planning on behalf of Eilean Eisdeal. Suzanne McIntosh is an experienced, qualified and independent Chartered Town Planner, Urban Designer and Mediator.

The information gained in this survey will be analysed and the outcomes and any recommendations will be reported to Eilean Eisdeal and Argyll and Bute Council.

As you may be aware the council Planners have been in discussion with Eilean Eisdeal after a complaint was made that building materials and rubbish have been dumped and stored at the Rush and Gush on Eilean Eisdeal land.

A meeting was held with the Planners and they have requested that Eilean Eisdeal submit a planning application to change the use of the land at the Rush and Gush to a formalised area for storage.

The discussions with the Planners brought to light that there are a number of points for the community to consider first before Eilean Eisdeal prepare any application.

These are:

- 1. How do we ensure that fly tipping is dealt with appropriately and effectively?
 - 2. How we get a bulky uplift service reinstated to the island to prevent goods being dumped indefinitely?
 - 3. Whether we use this opportunity to examine how we can better accommodate our waste needs and recycling as well as improving the appearance of the harbour?
- 4. How we can preserve our Category B Listed Harbour from further damage from the large landing craft docking at the pier walls and the wheelie bins being moved by heavy machinery?
 - 5. How we can better move heavy goods to and from the island in future?
